

Charlene Marshall (right) shows Karen Lemelle a display of Monongalia High School.




Founding Charter of the Morgantown Branch of the NAACP in 1937, recently donated to the Morgantown History Museum.




#### Charlene Marshall Speaks at the Morgantown History Museum

Former Morgantown Mayor Charlene Marshall spoke at the Morgantown History Museum on Saturday February 24. Titled "The African-American Experience in Morgantown During the Years of Segregation and After." She shared her outstanding research and her memories of growing up as a person of color to a large, diverse crowd. Marshall also served as a Morgantown City Council member and a West Virginia State Delegate.

In her PowerPoint presentation, Marshall named and located the segregated schools in Monongalia County, including many elementary schools in mining towns in the 1920's when the African-American population was at its peak, Morgantown's elementary schools, Beechurst and Monongalia County High Schools. She showed many historic photographs and traced the careers of leading educators, administrators and entreprenures in the African-American community.

"It was great because so many people stayed behind to talk to Charlene and fellow audience members afterward," according to Pamela Ball, founder and coordinator of the Morgantown History Museum.
